Ellington Charles Hawes August 1, 1894 - April 9, 1963



Grace Steell Hawes established the Ellington Charles Hawes Chair in Pediatrics at the Medical College of Georgia in honor and recognition of her husband in February, 1985. The Annual Hawes Lectureship was established in Pediatrics in April, 1996.

Mr. Hawes, fondly known as "Mr. Charlie," was an outstanding citizen who loved children, family, church and community. Mr. Hawes began working at the Bank of Thomson in 1911 as a teller. Over the years he was promoted to Chairman of the Board of Directors and President of the bank. An active member of the First United Methodist Church, Mr. Hawes served as the Superintendent of the Sunday school. He was Chairman of the Banking Committee in the 1953-1954 Georgia State Senate. He spent much time and energy working for a hospital facility in Thomson. When the McDuffie County Hospital opened in 1952 he was Chairman of the Hospital Authority.

He is remembered as a very kind and compassionate man who always "wanted things done right and wanted them done in the right way."
